FAITH AT THE CROSSROADS

... is a celebration of the 500th Anniversary of the Reformation. This promises to be an excellent evening of worship as we celebrate our gospel heritage and rejoice together in the doctrines of grace. The celebration will be introduced by Rev Chris Kennedy, minister of Dun Laoghaire. Jonathan Rea, along with singers and instrumentalists from New Irish Arts will be leading the praise. Jonathan has also composed a new hymn inspired by Martin Luther's life and writings which will be premiered at each event with the music and lyrics included in the printed programme. The evening will include video clips depicting key moments in Luther's life and there will be some Table Talk from a guest panel reflecting on Luther's legacy. The keynote speaker is Dr Conrad Mbewe, from Lusaka in Zambia. He is known as 'the Spurgeon of Africa' and will be preaching from Paul's Letter to the Romans which was so seminal in Martin Luther's own conversion. Each attendee will also receive a free copy of a new book by Keith & Kristyn Getty called 'SING' which references Martin Luther's role in bringing singing back into congregational life. Held on THURSDAY, 19 October at 7.30 pm in the Assembly Hall, Belfast this is a FREE event with no admission charge expected to finish around 9.00pm.
